Read different kinds of books with your student...funny books, nonfiction books or from their poetry notebooks. Take turns reading pages or chapters. Encourage your student to use expression in their voice as they read!

Ask your students ques-

tions about what they have read. Have them guess what they think will happen next. Take time to look at the pictures in the book—a picture can hold a lot of answers about the story.

You do not have to be an expert reader. Your student will simply like spending time with you. And hopefully like reading too!


SRO CITIZENSHIP AWARD
