#### **BUS RULES!!!**

Keep in mind these few rules if your student rides the school bus....

- 2) Use a Level 1 voice (quiet voice) on the bus
- 3) Keep your hands and feet to self at all times!
- 4) Always use kind words!
- 5) No food, candy or drinks on the bus is district policy.

\*If a student does not follow these rules, they can be written up and lose bus privileges.



### End of the Day...Here's the Scoop...



BEW will continue our dismissal pattern in the back parking lots after school. We have included a traffic plan for you to familiarize yourself with the pattern. Kindergarten students and their siblings will be picked up in the FRONT parking lot off of Shannon Ave. Third and fourth graders will also be picked up in this lot. First and second graders will be picked up in the in BACK lot off of Shannon Ave. Siblings should go with the youngest student's homeroom for dismissal. Dismissal time for car riders is 3:25 p.m. except for kindergarten ONLY students who will be released at 3:15 p.m. It is recommended that no one lineup for dismissal until 3:00 p.m. Please stay in your car and in your lane of traffic to help speed up our dismissal process.

Walkers will be released at 3:20 p.m. out of the side door facing Shannon Ave. We are asking parents to wait for their walkers on the sidewalk on Shannon Ave. Teachers will walk them up to the sidewalk to meet you. DO NOT PARK in the parking lot while waiting for your student. Please park across the street. Due to our traffic pattern, it will not be possible for cars to get out of the lot. Traffic in our lot is ONE WAY.

A student's instructional day does not end until **3:25 p.m**. Valuable instruction is missed when students leave school early. Please make every attempt to keep students in the classroom the entire school day. Calls to the classroom interrupts students' learning. According to our Student Handbook, "phone calls regarding stu-1) Stay seated until you get off the bus dent's dismissal procedures are unacceptable unless it is an emergency situation. Any change in your student's established dismissal routine (such as going to another relative or friend's house, not riding the bus, change in bus stop, latchkey plans, etc.) MUST be in writing from the parent and given to the classroom teacher before the 8:55 a.m. bell." We are asking that you please DO NOT call the school during the day with this type of information unless it is an emergency. A doctor's note or other documentation may be required. Please understand, this



We hope that with everyone's cooperation and patience, dismissal will go smoothly again this year. It is our main priority to keep our students safe. We have over 650 students at Barberton Elementary West and want to see a timely but SAFE dismissal for all students. If we have to make adjustments along the way, we will be sure to let you know!

## **New Student Attendance Laws**

Daily attendance is important to student learning. While we understand that students get sick and family emergencies happen, we also know that learning is missed when a student is absent. Although some homework can be made up, there is hands-on learning that takes place in the classroom daily. Please try to have your student be a HERO (Here, Everyday, Ready-to-learn and On-time!)

New state attendance laws will are now measured in hours. Barberton City Schools continues to review their attendance policies. Students will have 'excessive absences' when:

- Absent 38 or more hours in one month with or without a legitimate excuse
- Absent 65 or more hours in one year with or without a legitimate excuse

Students will be considered 'habitually truant' when they are:

- absent 30 or more consecutive hours without a legitimate excuse
- Absent 42 or more hours in a month without a legitimate excuse
- Absent 72 or more hours in a school year without a legitimate excuse

Attendance will be docu-



mented on the report cards. By hours. Attendance Intervention Meetings may be held when attendance becomes a concern. A plan may be put in place.

Legitimate excuses for attendance purposes are defined as follows:

- Illness of student
- Illness of family requiring presence of student
- Quarantine of home
- Death of relative
- Medical or dental appointment
- Observance of religious holiday
- Emergency or other circumstance in which school deems sufficient cause to miss

March 11 May 13


