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SENIOR EXAMS

Final assessments for seniors will be administered Thursday and Friday, May 7th and 8th. Our teachers will give specific instructions concerning each assessment. The make-up date for any assessments that are missed must be Monday, 11th. A final assessment activity <u>must</u> be completed for each class unless the student has met the policy for exemption from the exam (Board Policy #6.040). Students in early placement work situations with vocational classes need to check with each teacher to arrange to take their assessments. Be certain all assessment activities are completed so that it does not cause the senior to lose credit for a class and have to return for the fall semester or attend summer school. **No matter what grade you are receiving in a class, you do <u>NOT</u> receive credit for the class until the assessment is taken.**

Students will report to their regular classrooms or to the Media Center for their exams. Some lab or shop classes may be assigned to an alternate room. The classroom teacher will let you know where the senior is to report.

- There is no acceptable excuse for missing an assessment other than a documented illness or funeral. Remember, no matter what grade you are receiving in a class, you do **NOT receive credit for a class until** the assessment is taken!
- · If a senior meets the requirements for the senior exam policy, (Board Policy #6.040), he or she will be excused from those exams for which they qualify.

Board Policy #6.040

Seniors may be excused from a *second semester* senior year exam when:

- · He or she earns or is earning an "A" or "B" for each of the grading periods second semester.
- · He or she has not had any assignments to ISS, Thursday School or OSS or detentions (assigned by that classroom teacher) or teacher referrals to an administrator <u>during the entire second semester</u>.
- · Attendance must clearly fall within the accepted guidelines.

Please note: May 7th and 8th are regular school days and seniors are required to attend class on those days.

Senior's Last Day

Class of 2020

Seniors Last Day will be May 8th if the senior has met the following criteria:

- 1. On track to graduate
 - a. Passing all classes
 - b. Does not need courses in Grad Point
- 2. Senior hours have been completed and turned in by April 15th.
- 3. No discipline issues: No OSS during their senior year.
- 4. Cannot have 10 days of unexcused absences second semester.
- 5. Have all 18 points needed on state tests, including 4 points in English and 4 points in math. *OR Have the alternative path solidly in place.*

Seniors last day for those who do not meet the above criteria will be May 21st.

Seniors who will need to complete courses in Grad Point or Nova Net or who are failing a course second semester will use the weeks of May $11^{th} - 15^{th}$ and May $18^{th} - 20^{th}$ to finish academic requirements.

MANDATORY COMMENCEMENT REHEARSAL

Rehearsal for commencement will be held at Barberton High School on Thursday, May 21st, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. It will last approximately a few hours. Attendance is MANDATORY. The rest of that day may be used to make certain any outstanding obligations are taken care of. Otherwise, you will receive an empty diploma cover on graduation day.

The rehearsal will include specific instructions for commencement. We will rehearse the processional and recessional and go over the entire program in detail. REHEARSAL FOR GRADUATION IS MANDATORY!! GRADUATES MUST BE THERE. IF THEY ARE NOT AT REHEARSAL YOU WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO ATTEND THE GRADUATION CEREMONY.

<u>Tickets will be required for family and guests to attend graduation</u>. Each student will be given five free tickets. Students will be able to purchase five extra tickets after graduation rehearsal. Extra tickets will be on sale for \$5.00 each. Graduates will be able to pick up their tickets AFTER graduation rehearsal and after they have completed a senior checkout form. ALL obligations must be taken care of before the graduate will be given his/her tickets for graduation. Obligations include but are not limited to senior hours, fees, all books returned, etc.

If you need special seating arrangements for disabled family members or guests, see Mrs. Wesolowski before or after graduation practice. You will not need a special ticket for the reserved handicapped seating section. Please understand that this seating is limited and only one additional guest will be permitted seating in this section.

COMMENCEMENT DRESS CODE

GIRLS – dresses or dress pants and tops and shoes. Although the girls receive a collar piece in their cap and gown package, collars are not to be worn. They do not add to the appearance and are a bother.

BOYS – dark trousers and shoes; shirt with collar and tie to be worn.

Shoes are required. **NO** sandals or tennis shoes are allowed. Your apparel will be checked during the assembly period before commencement.

STUDENTS WHO DO NOT DRESS FORMALLY WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE CEREMONY AT THE DISCRETION OF THE ADMINISTRATION

OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Each senior must see that <u>ALL</u> obligations are fulfilled before receiving his/her diploma. This includes credits, fees, cap and gown, announcements, disciplinary matters, and all other obligations. ALL books must be returned to the school and fines paid. All equipment, books, materials, and athletic items must be turned in or paid for.

- All obligations must be cleared up no later than 12:00 P.M. April 15th in order to attend prom. No personal checks can be accepted after April 15th, 2020.
- · All other obligations MUST be cleared up by May 22nd, 2020 in order to receive graduation tickets and to participate in the graduation ceremony. No personal checks can be accepted after April 15th, 2020.

Diplomas

Students who have outstanding obligations and who do not receive their diplomas at graduation will be able to pick up their diplomas in the Principal's Office after fulfilling their obligation. All other students will receive their correct diplomas during the ceremony.

Caps and Gowns

Each graduate is required to wear a cap and gown at graduation. Cap and gown information will be distributed by Jostens on Friday, September 20, 2019. Our Jostens representative will be at BHS on September 25, 2019 and September 26, 2019 to take cap and gown orders. The cost of the cap and gown is \$35.00. Graduates who would like to wear a former graduate's cap and gown may do so. Tassels may be purchased separately. Caps and gowns will be distributed the week of May 4th.

Senior Checkout/Final Transcript Request

All seniors will complete a mandatory senior checkout form. Senior checkout forms will be distributed the week of May 4th and need to be turned in at graduation rehearsal in order to receive their five graduation tickets. Seniors will complete a mandatory Senior Exit Survey from our guidance department. This form includes information regarding their post high school plans as well as where our college bound graduates would like their final transcript sent. *ALL UNIVERSITIES REQUIRE THAT GRADUATING SENIORS WHO WILL ATTEND IN THE SUMMER/FALL REQUEST TO THEIR HIGH SCHOOL THAT THEIR FINAL TRANSCRIPT BE SENT UPON GRADUATION*. The Guidance Office will send final transcripts the second week of June once all grades have been finalized.

Board Policy Pertaining to Graduation

5460 Graduation Requirements: Commencement exercises will include only those students who have successfully completed requirements for graduation as certified by the high school principal or those students who have been deemed eligible to participate in such exercises in accordance with the terms of their IEP. No student who has completed the requirements for graduation shall be denied a diploma as a disciplinary measure. A student may be denied participation in the ceremony of graduation when personal conduct so warrants

Senior Hours

As a requirement of Barberton graduation, each senior must complete a total of 10 service hours during his/her senior year. These hours may be performed from May 1, 2019 until April 15, 2020. In order to better serve the community, the following guidelines apply to all service hours:

- 1. The service hours should be done for a Barberton community **non-profit agency or group.** ***If you wish to do service hours at an agency or church that is not based in Barberton, you must receive approval before proceeding or the hours will not be counted. The ten hours can be accumulated from different sites.
- 2. Absolutely NO hours will be approved or accepted for service done for a single individual.
- 3. The attached form must be completely, filled out, and contain verifying signatures and phone numbers.
- 4. All forms must be turned in prior to the due date of April 15, 2020 to Mrs. Wesolowski in Mr Hartzell's office.
- 5. Your service hours must occur outside the normally scheduled school day. (They may be completed during the summer.) (THIS APPLIES TO ALL SENIORS INCLUDING CCP AND CAREER TECH)
- 6. Services for which you were paid in either cash or benefits are ineligible. Example: If you are paid a salary as a camp counselor for your church or if you coach a little league team but the proceeds from registration pay for a private camp you will be attending later in the summer; you will not receive service credit.

This photo serves as a placeholder and will be replaced with a school-appropriate senior photo if submitted on time by one of the submission methods listed below. **Seniors who do NOT have a picture taken by Lifetouch will NOT have a senior photo included in the yearbook.**

12th Grade Students

Notice of Needed Immunization

Ohio State Law requires all 12th grade students to receive a meningococcal conjugate vaccine

(MCV4). This is a newer requirement. Students who do not meet this requirement will be

excluded from school in the fall of their 12th grade year until they have received the needed

immunization.

The immunization can be obtained through your child's personal physician, at any walk-in clinic

such as the one at Walgreens in Barberton, Akron Health Department, and Axess Pointe

Community Health Center located on Robinson Avenue (in the same building as Ritzman's

Pharmacy).

You must provide the school with a copy of the shot record. Just drop it off at the Main Office

(Office hrs. 7:00 am – 3:00 pm) or mail it to Barberton High School, 555 Barber Rd. to update

your records. Those students who are exempted from vaccines must bring in a form signed by

the physician indicating the exemption.
