Title | Funding

Title I federal dollars are used at BMS to provide additional resources to support students who are achieving below grade level. At BMS, we focus our Title I efforts in the areas of Reading and Math. We are fortunate to have a Title I tutor who works with students on a daily basis so students can gain more confidence and independence when reading and solving math equations. In addition, Title I funds are used to provide after school and summer school tutoring for students who qualify for those services.

At BMS we continue to focus on meeting the specific needs of all of our students.
