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Bullying...what exactly is it??

There is a lot of talk these days about bullying. Bullying is something we take very seriously at Barberton Elementary West. It is important to handle bully situations correctly and know how to talk to your student about it. The most important thing is to know the difference between bullying and kids being mean or rude. With the assistance of Mrs. Newlan. our School Counselor, we have put together some tips that should help!

KNOW THE DIFFER-ENCE

Not every situation is bullying. Many times, it is kids being mean or impulsive. Here are definitions to help you know the difference.

RUDE-

Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else **MEAN**—purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once or maybe twice

BULLYING—

intentionally aggressive behaviors, repeated over time to show power over someone

If your student tells you of a problem at school with another student, attempt to find out what kind of issue it is. Talk with them and possibly the classroom teacher in hopes of resolving it.

HELP KIDS UNDER-STAND BULLYING

Students who understand what bullying is can quickly identify it and help themselves and others. They need to know safe ways to stand up and get help.

- Encourage students to tell a trusted adult. It needs to be reported immediately, not a day or week later.

- Tell the bully or mean student, "We don't do that here!" We want our students to be respectful and responsible in our words and actions everyday.
- Keep lines of communication open with your student. Ask them about their day. Be positive!
- Be involved in their education. Attend school activities.
 Help them with their homework.
 Read with them.

We want all our students to feel safe and welcome at BEW. It is important to know the difference in student behaviors so we can approach them and handle them in the best way. Thank you for your continued support!

Dismissal Procedures







Please be sure that any changes to a student's dismissal is in writing to the homeroom teacher by 8:55am. The office is unable to take any phone calls to change a student's dismissal procedure after 1:00pm unless it is an emergency.

The student's instructional day ends at 3:25pm so we ask that students do not leave school early unless absolutely necessary. Doctor's notes may be required the following day when signing a student out early.

Dismissal procedures are working out very well! Please continue to follow appropriate procedures. Thank you again for your patience as we dismiss over 700 students **safely** in a 15 minute time period!



Friendly Reminders!

Check your student's purple folder every night. Important information is sent home through their folders.

Doors do not open for breakfast until 8:15am.

Students not going to breakfast should not be dropped off until 8:30am—there is no adult on duty until that time!!

Students should be in class by 8:55am or they will be considered tardy.

Read with your student every night for at least 20 minutes. Your student will be a better reader.
