Bullying vs. Mean

There is a lot of talk these days about bullying. Bullying is something we take very seriously at Barberton Elementary West. It is important to handle bully situations correctly and know how to talk to your student about it. The most important thing is to know the difference between bullying and kids being mean or rude. With the assistance of Mrs. Newlan, our School Counselor, we have put together some tips that should help!

KNOW THE DIFFER-ENCE

Not every situation is bullying. Many times, it is kids being mean or impulsive. Here are definitions to help you know the difference.

RUDE-

Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else

MEAN—purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once or maybe twice

BULLYING-

intentionally aggressive behaviors, repeated over time to show power over someone

If your student tells you of a problem at school with another student, attempt to find out what kind of issue it is. Talk with them and possibly the classroom teacher in hopes of resolving it.

HELP KIDS UNDER-STAND BULLYING

Students who understand what bullying is can quickly identify it and help themselves and others. They need to know safe ways to stand up and get help.

- Encourage students to tell a trusted adult. It needs to be reported immediately, not a day or week later.
- Tell the bully or mean student, "We don't do that here!" We want our students to be respectful and responsible in our words and actions everyday.
- Keep lines of communication open with your student. Ask them about their day. Be positive!
- Be involved in their education. Attend school activities.
 Help them with their homework. Read with them.

We want all our students to feel safe and welcome at BEW. It is important to know the difference in student behaviors so we can approach them and handle them in the best way. Thank you for your continued support!

Please encourage the following rules if your student rides the school bus....


- 1) Stay seated until you get off the bus

ALL DAY, EVERY DAY

Daily attendance is important to student learning. This year, our district has implemented ALL DAY, EVERY DAY. This is stressing the importantance of daily attendance throughout the district.

Last year, our school had 31% of students that missed 10 or more days of school. While we understand that students get sick and family emergencies happen, we also know that important lessons are missed when a student is absent. Although some homework can be made up, there is hands-on learning that takes place in the classroom daily. Please try to have your student at school, on time, daily.

Keep in mind, according to new state laws, attendance is now measured in hours. Students will have **'excessive absences'** when:

- Absent **38 or more hours in one month** without a legitimate excuse (6 days)
- Absent **65 or more hours in one year** without a legitimate excuse (11 days)

Legitimate excuses for attendance purposes are defined as follows:

- Illness of student
- Illness of family requiring presence of student
- Quarantine of home



- Death of relative
- Medical or dental appointment
- Observance of religious holiday
- Emergency or other circumstance in which school deems sufficient cause to miss

Documentation may be required for excused absences. Attendance intervention meetings may also be required for those who have been identified with **'excessive absences.'**

Bottom line, please make every effort to have your student here **ALL DAY, EVERY DAY!**


