Returning to In-Person Learning

Welcome Back!

We are so happy to see all of the students in the building and the students seem just as happy to be back! It continues to be another challenging year but together with everyone's support and communication, we feel this will be a very productive year! Some of our students have been out of a structured school setting for 18 months! Our teachers will work hard so that all students show one year's growth! We will need your support at home this year too.

All students were issued a chromebook this year. They should take it home every night and bring it back to school fully charged the next day. At home, they can work on eSpark lessons, RAZ Kids and math facts. We ask that you follow up and make sure students are doing this.

Back in the classroom, we are doing everything we can to ensure everyone has a safe and healthy year. Students' desks are at least 3ft. apart from one another. We are making every attempt to keep our classrooms in a pod, or cohort, and not to mix them with others during the day. We continue to encourage handwashing and sanitizing. Students also eat breakfast in the classroom and while most will eat lunch in the cafeteria, they will be 6ft. apart to limit the number of students having to quarantine. Most recently, the district did make • Report cards go the decision to require masks at this time. This will help our schools stay open and students able to learn in person, in a classroom with their peers and a teacher.

We continue to put a focus on sanitizing the building and wiping down high traffic areas throughout the day. We have one way hallways and staircases.

This is not how we expected our school year to be—again. We continue to hope these changes are temporary and things will get back to "normal" at some point. But for now, everyone is making the best of it! We ask for your patience and understanding.

Students did a great job wearing masks last year and I am sure they will continue to do so this year. Many students were already wearing masks to start the year. They can do it!

BUS RULES!!!

Please encourage the following rules if your student rides the school bus....

- 1) Students should sit in assigned seat.
- 2) Stay seated until you get off the bus.
- 3) Use a Level 1 voice (quiet voice) on the bus.
- 4) Keep your hands and feet to yourself at all times!
- 5) Always use kind words!
- 6) No food, candy or drinks on the bus.

*If a student does not follow these rules, they can be written up and lose bus privileges.

Bullying vs. Mean

There is a lot of talk these days about bullying. Bullying is something we take very seriously at Barberton Elementary West. It is important to handle bully situations correctly and know how to talk to your student about it. The most important thing is to know the difference between bullying and kids being mean or rude. With the assistance of Mrs. Newlan, our School Counselor, we have put together some tips that should help!

KNOW THE DIFFERENCE

Not every situation is bullying. Many times, it is kids being mean or impulsive. Here are definitions to help you know the difference.

RUDE—

Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else

MEAN—purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once or maybe twice

BULLYING—intentionally aggressive behaviors, repeated over time to show power over someone

If your student tells you of a problem at school with another student, attempt to find out what kind of issue it is. Talk with them and possibly the classroom teacher in hopes of resolving it.

HELP KIDS UNDERSTAND BULLYING

Students who understand what bullying is can quickly identify it and help themselves and others. They need to know safe ways to stand up and get help.

- Encourage students to tell a trusted adult. It needs to be reported immediately, not a day or week later.
- Tell the bully or mean student, "We don't do that here!" We want our students to be respectful and responsible in our words and actions everyday.
- Keep lines of communication open with your student. Ask them about their day. Be positive!
- Be involved in their education. Attend school activities. Help them with their homework. Read with them.

Marco's Pizza Night - It's back again! Have dinner with the family while giving back to our school!


