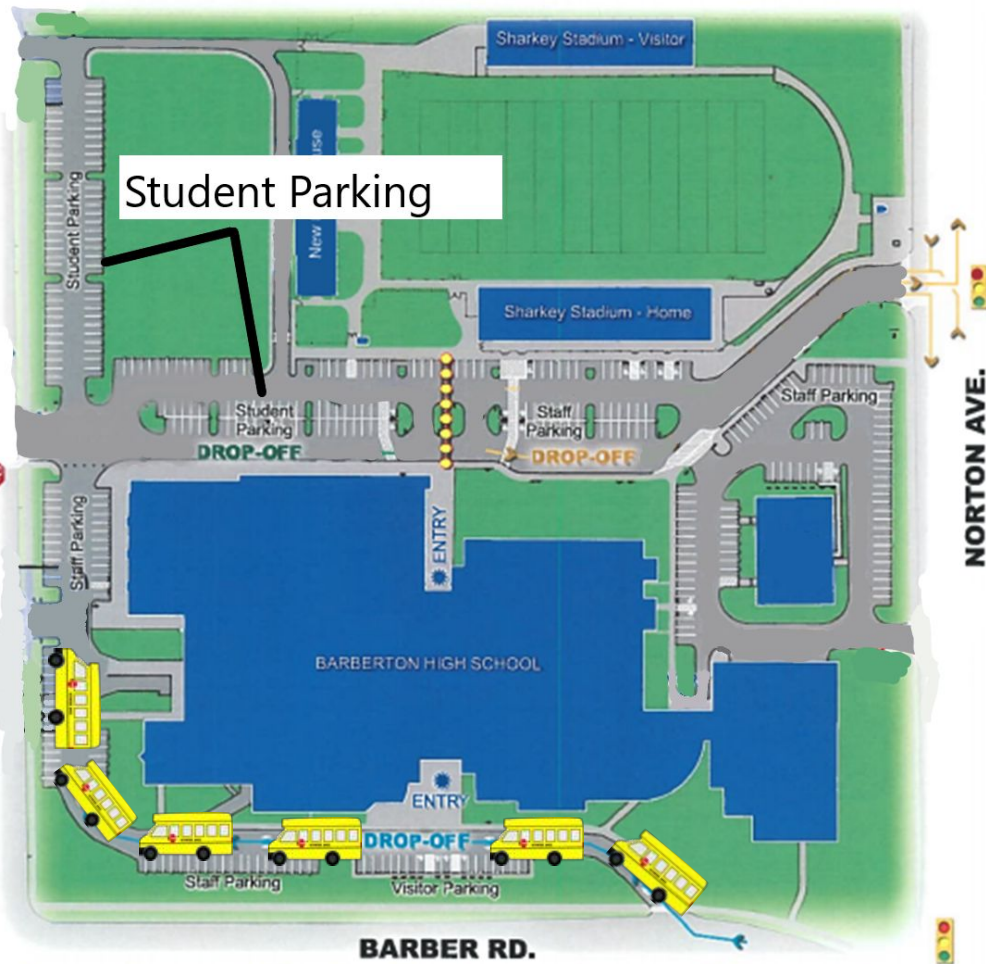

BE READY All Day, Every Day

- Call off 330-753-1084 follow directions for call off
