Reading Tips for Parents of Toddlers

- -Don't expect your toddler to sit still for a book. Toddlers need to MOVE, they may be moving, but they are listening.
- -Recite rhymes, sing songs, pause to let your toddler finish a phrase or chant a refrain.
- -Choose engaging books featuring animals or machines that invite movement and making sounds.
- -Keep reading short, simple, and often.
- -Encourage play that involves naming, describing, and communicating.
- -Choose books about everyday experiences and feelings.
- -Ask questions and take time to listen to your toddler's answers.
- -Read favorite stories again and again.

- -Read together every day.
- -Giving everything a name helps build a child's vocabulary.
- -Say how much you enjoy reading.
- -Read with fun in your voice.
- -Know when to stop. It's okay to stop if your child loses interest or is having trouble paying attention.
- -Be interactive. Discuss what's happening in the book.
- -Read it again and again. Go ahead and read your child's favorite book for the 100th time!
- -Talk about writing, too. Mention to your child how we read from left to right and how words are separated by spaces.
- -Point out print everywhere. Talk about the written words you see in the world around you. Ask your child to find a new word on each outing.
