REMOTE LEARNING- CONTENT DELIVERY

It is important to keep a normal learning schedule as much as possible in this uncertain time. Beginning on Monday, April 13, 2020, students will begin to login to their Google classroom(s) for Remote Learning content and assignments. Teachers will work diligently each week to post content (including instructions, assignments and learning materials), monitor students' digital presence, and provide feedback on assignments. Assignments will be posted Monday by 9:00 AM for the week and due that Sunday by 11:59 PM. Additionally, teachers may offer "Google Meet" sessions that allow students the opportunity to connect (in real-time) with teachers for support. Preschool students will be given an "At Home Learning Packet".

Students are encouraged to connect with teachers through Google Classroom, Class DOJO and/or email to ask questions, clarify assignment details, or to seek other general support.
