In Barberton Schools we are very proud to offer our PreK-12 students outstanding academics from highly qualified teachers AND an abundance of equally important life skills!

The **Do Your Job** program is the centerpoint for these skills and opportunities, but we also offer a Career Communications class, Financial Literacy, exposure to a variety of career pathways, Math for Life for practical and useful math, Four Cities Compact programs, and dozens of afterschool and summer programs, apprenticeships, and internships.

As educators, we feel to create a well-rounded, successful adult — which is our goal — our students must be exposed to opportunities and real situations, helping them develop life skills alongside academics.

To further this focus we are introducing the **21 Magic Skills** — skills that will pay you forever.

In order to graduate from Barberton High School an individual needs 21 required academic credits. We are introducing the 21 Magic Skills this year to complement our academic requirement. When a student earns 21 academic credits — and has mastered these 21 Magic Skills — they are way ahead in life.

After the 21 required academic credits your student must earn, these 21 Magic Skills provide your student with a clear understanding of how life works, setting them up for success. Students can start earning academic credits in 8th grade, but the 21 Magic Skills will be part of our approach to PreK-12. Read through these valuable and necessary skills and reinforce them at home. Supporting us in this way is a great way to set your student up for success in life. We will do our part.

Looking back at my experience, I wish I had mastered more of these earlier in my life. Some I'm still working on. I think we are all a work in progress. I have past students asking me why we did not learn these things in school. Now we are!

A Safe, Secure Environment for Learning

We are committed to the safety of our students and staff through a comprehensive approach along with strong community partnerships.

Dedicated School Resource Officers (SROs) are present in every building, fostering relationships with students and providing an extra layer of security. Officers Marty Eberhart, Robert Velo, Robert Russell and Steve Coborn have come to know our students, providing a familiarity and trust with them.

The same goes for our dedicated school crossing guards, whose friendly greetings and safety precautions help our students daily.

To be prepared, we do ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training, which teaches everyone what to do in case of a lockdown. We also use RAPTOR to conduct background checks on visitors, enhance security, and communicate important information during fire drills.

Our School Safety Council meets quarterly to help evaluate and update security measures to address emerging challenges, providing a secure and nurturing learning environment where everyone can thrive.

Social & Emotional WELLNESS

We recognize that the importance of students' social-emotional wellness is an important factor in our students' school performance – and the rest of their lives.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

In addition to two staff school counselors, the district partners with Red Oak Behavioral Health, Fight or Flight, Limitless Ambition, Peter James & Associates, I am Possible, iCARE Mentoring, Greenleaf Family Center, Child Guidance and Family Solutions and Coleman Health Services to help students understand how they manage their emotions and their response to other people.

PEER SUPPORT / MORNING MEETINGS

Each morning, teachers at every grade level facilitate meetings to guide students to work together on life skills that help them develop the ability to build strong relationships, teaching empathy and cooperation among students. In these 15-20 minute meetings, students are encouraged to share their lives and advice with each other.

PBIS (POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTIONS AND SUPPORTS)

This system of POSITIVE feedback rewards students for exemplary behavior. Students showing constant appropriate behaviors, improved behaviors and extraordinary behaviors will receive recognition like positive phone calls and emails home and rewards such as Magic Money (to be turned in for gift cards and prize drawings).

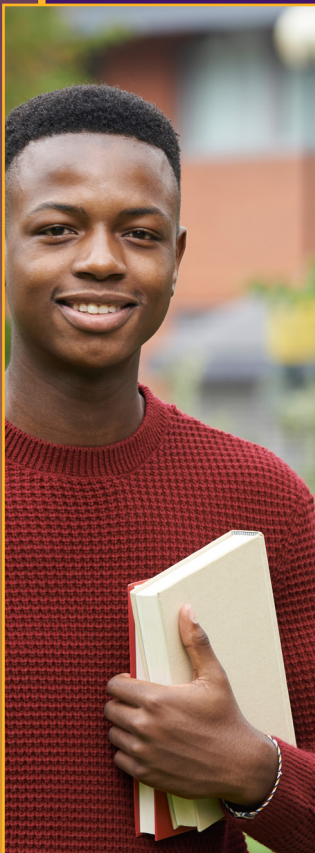
Lean Six Sigma

Preschool Is a Smart Start for Your Children

Barberton Preschool provides an environment for our students to explore, gain a sense of self, build confidence, and socialize with peers — all while setting a strong foundation for learning that follows them throughout their education. Barberton preschoolers gain the skills and the development they need to prepare them for the Ohio Kindergarten Readiness Assessment. Our preschoolers also start preparing for the Third Grade Reading Guarantee Mandate.

Our preschool program offers six morning and six afternoon classes (half day, up to 16 students in each, available to 3-5 year old Barberton residents). All preschool teachers are licensed by the state of Ohio. Transportation is available to all students with disabilities and typical peers who live more than one mile from the preschool.

Community Partnerships

HELPING EACH OTHER

Everyone is proud when our schools graduate conscientious students who value family and community. That's why so many organizations offer their partnership and support.

SCHOLARSHIPS

These include the Barberton Community Foundation for distributing 48 different scholarships totaling \$395,025 (\$163,025 committed for the '23/'24 school year). Those numbers include 18 community scholarships and 28 fund scholarships along with the Foundation's four-year awards.

BUSINESS ADVISORY COUNCIL

We have more than 50 partners on our Business Advisory Council (BAC). Most districts do not have a stand-alone BAC — but we wanted to do it right and make sure that we are impacting the Barberton community, business partners, and students.

WELLNESS

Through awareness, counseling services and other means of support, many organizations contribute to the health and wellness of our students and their families. They include Coleman Health Services, Ben Curtis Family Foundation, the Kiwanis, Rotary Club, Red Oak Behavioral Health and many others.

JOBS

Several times per year, Superintendent Jeff Ramnytz meets with area business leaders to better understand the challenges employers are facing. The intention is to build more skills into our curriculum to benefit area businesses and to find job opportunities for students and graduates. Participants include the mayor's office, Summit JOGS, iCARE Mentoring, Fastenal, Malco, Marc's, Barberton Community Foundation, Barberton Police and Fire Department, Finley Plumbing, Sparton Enterprises, Barberton City Council, University of Akron, Barberton Tree Service, Merriweather Foam, RSS Maclin, Novation Solutions, Bounce, and Four Cities Compact — and more.

Last year, we held Manufacturing Awareness Night to teach the public — including our young adults — the rewards of a career in an industry that is booming locally and needs great workers.

Examples of financially sensible decision-making:

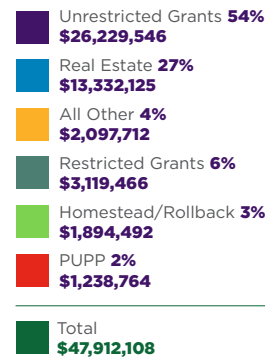
By demolishing the old administration building last year, we saved the district from unnecessary and expensive overhead costs. With these savings, we were able to open the preschool in the current administration building.

Grant Funds

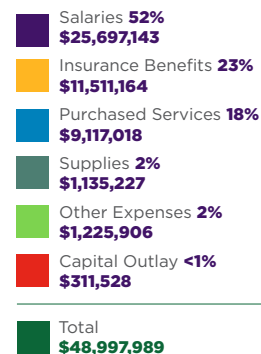
Barberton City Schools receives Grant Funds that BCS Staff takes advantage of seeking out to help defray the costs of professional development, classroom materials, instruction and other educational needs. The monies benefit all Barberton City Schools students and staff. The total grants received were \$8,936,297.62 in Federal Funds. In addition to the Federal Funds received, BCS staff applied for \$988,187.98 in Local and Federal Grants for the 2022-2023 school year.

Saved energy in our LEED-certified elementary school buildings: LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) is an internationally recognized green building program and these buildings were one of the first in Ohio to open with this designation.
